

Bring Transparency to the Access Rights and Group Definitions in Your IBM Domino / Notes Environment

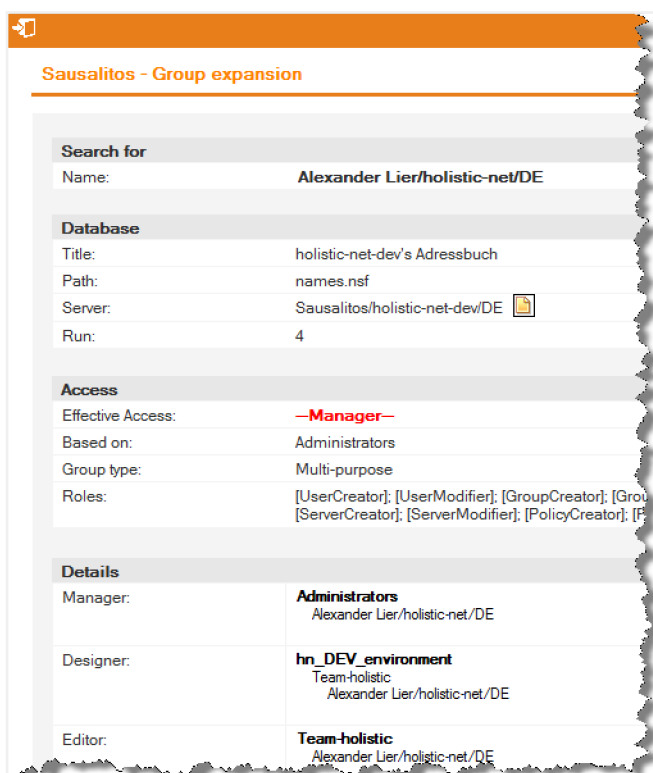


Two products in one package: holistic access check + holistic group check

Administrative Problem Areas

The IBM Notes / Domino programs do not ship with software or tools to easily and quickly display who has which rights to which applications in a company-wide IBM Notes / Domino infrastructure. Additional tools must be used. For many reasons, dynamic group resolution for the clarification of access rights is imperative.

As your company grows and changes, so do the group definitions. Unused groups, invalid members, unconventional names, illegal nested groups, inconsistencies; these are but a few of the problems that arise over time. Bringing order to this particular bit of chaos requires a powerful tool.



Application Data Sources



The ideal source for the information is **holistic application management**. There, an inventory can be created for as many domains and servers and their applications as desired. Ideally, all applications are listed in a full inventory of the Notes Topology. Alternatively, a CATALOG.nsf can be used as a data source for the application data.

Solution

holistic access and group check is the tool you seek! Keeping an overview of group and access rights and solving the aforementioned issues becomes a simple matter.

The **holistic access check** creates a document for each user/group and for each application. Seeing which applications a user has access to or which users can access a particular database is as easy as opening a document. These documents also display the effective access from the applications' ACL!

holistic group check searches for inconsistencies and errors in the group definitions. The results are presented in a log document. Simply input the naming conventions in a configuration document. This test can run periodically to insure the proper standards for your business are maintained.

Doclinks are created to Person Documents and Group Documents in the address book as well as to applications via the catalog.nsf. In this way, **holistic application management** enables immediate changes to errors in the access rights to applications and in group definitions.
